My son, Cory Hanson, was killed in the accident in Wisconsin on March 25, 1999. Our lives have not been the same since that horrible day. A part of me died that day. I have lost so much. I will never see him get married, or just be able to sit on my back porch and have our little talks that we used to have. No more Christmas mornings, birthdays, or Mother's day to share.

Everyone in our family has suffered due to losing Cory. His son is growing up without a father to watch him play baseball, soccer, football, or to come and watch him at his school programs. His brother doesn't have anyone just to hang out with. His dad can't work on cars with him, or on other projects they used to do. He has nieces and nephews that are never going to know him.

The purpose of this letter is to request that you do not use door-to-door sales. They use young teens and young adults, and they are treated very badly. You make a lot of money selling your magazines excluding the use of door-to-door sales. Your magazines are in every Wal-mart, drugstore, and grocery store around the world. Doesn't that make you enough money without using kids to sell your magazines? They are being mistreated, and are left in various states, and are left with no money or way home. They are being exploited, exposed to drug use and exposed to risks that can kill them. Stop contributing to the exploitation and death of our children by stopping door-to-door sales.
