Plaintiff, PITTS SALES, INC., sues Defendants, KING WORLD PRODUCTIONS, INC., LARRY POSNER and MATTHEW T. YULE, and alleges as follows:

NATURE OF ACTION

1. This action is brought pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2520 for violation of the federal wiretapping provisions contained in 18 U.S.C. § 2511 and pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 1964 for violation of the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act, 18 U.S.C. § 1961 *et seq.* Also alleged are state common law claims for damages.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

2. This action properly lies in a United States District Court pursuant to (a) 28 U.S.C. §1331 because United States District Courts have exclusive original jurisdiction over federal claims, and (2) 28 U.S.C. §1367, which provides this Court authority to exercise its supplemental jurisdiction to adjudicate the state common law claims alleged.

3. This action properly lies in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1391 because: (a) a substantial part of Defendants' illegal conduct and the events giving rise to PITTS SALES' claims occurred in the Southern District of Florida; and (b) Defendants transact substantial business and may otherwise be found in the Southern District of Florida.

THE PARTIES

4. Plaintiff, PITTS SALES, INC. ("PITTS SALES"), is a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Florida and has its principal office and place of business in Broward County, Florida.

5. Defendant, KING WORLD PRODUCTIONS, INC. ("KING WORLD"), is a foreign corporation organized under the laws of the State of Delaware and is registered to do business and is doing business in Florida. KING WORLD is engaged, among other things, in the business of broadcasting, producing and distributing television programs in interstate commerce. KING WORLD produces and broadcasts Inside Edition, a television show which is broadcast throughout the United States, including the State of Florida.

6. Upon information and belief, Defendant, LARRY POSNER ("POSNER"), is sui juris, a resident of the State of New York and has conducted business in Broward County, Florida. POSNER is an employee of KING WORLD and participated in illegal acts on behalf of KING WORLD and with the approval and consent of KING WORLD throughout the United States, including within the State of Florida.

7. Upon information and belief, Defendant, MATTHEW T. YULE ("YULE"), is sui juris, a resident of the State of New York and has conducted business in Broward County, Florida. YULE is an employee of KING WORLD and participated in illegal acts on behalf of KING WORLD and with the approval and consent of KING WORLD throughout

the United States, including within the State of Florida.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

8. KING WORLD produces and distributes Inside Edition worldwide. Inside Edition is a television "news" show that is presented to a large audience worldwide. Inside Edition produces stories of a sensational nature that are "inside," "undercover," "investigative" and designed to garner large audiences with significant financial rewards and status within the television industry. Inside Edition engages in "tabloid-style" cut throat journalism to shock its viewers. Inside Edition often uses questionable tactics such as hidden cameras in order to obtain footage necessary to frame its "news" stories. Inside Edition's tactics have resulted in it being the longest running and highest-rated news magazine show in syndication.

9. Sometime in 2003, Inside Edition decided to film, produce and air a story about magazine sales companies. POSNER is a producer for Inside Edition who had primary responsibility for Inside Edition's story about magazine sales companies.

10. PITTS SALES is a magazine sales company. Agents working with PITTS SALES travel the country and canvass individuals, generally on a door to door basis, for the purpose of selling magazine subscriptions.

11. In each location where the company travels, the agents stay at various hotels. PITTS SALES rents hotel rooms and conference rooms in the hotels to transact its daily business. PITTS SALES also transacts business in its company vehicles. Due to the transitional nature of the business, the hotel rooms, conference rooms and company vehicles are PITTS SALES' offices and are entitled to the same level of privacy as private residences and offices.

WORLD, conspired to have YULE undertake a clandestine mission to be hired to work with PITTS SALES so that he could use a hidden camera to film the agents and employees of PITTS SALES and use said film footage in Inside Edition's story about magazine sales companies. Each of YULE's actions as alleged herein were taken under the direction of POSNER and with the knowledge and consent of KING WORLD and were within the scope of YULE's employment with KING WORLD.

13. In July 2003, PITTS SALES was conducting interviews for sales agents at a hotel in Minnesota. YULE flew from New York to Minnesota for the sole purpose of deceiving PITTS SALES into hiring him so that he could obtain hidden camera footage of PITTS SALES' agents and employees in the course of their business. Said footage was to be used in Inside Edition's story about magazine sales companies.

14. On July 16, 2003, YULE showed up at a PITTS SALES interview in Minnesota and applied for a sales position with PITTS SALES. At the interview, YULE deliberately, purposefully and with the consent of POSNER and KING WORLD misrepresented his personal information, his qualifications for the sales position and his reason for seeking the position. Moreover, YULE never mentioned that he was currently employed by KING WORLD or that he was planning to obtain hidden camera footage while associated with PITTS SALES in order to use the footage in an uncomplimentary television story about PITTS SALES. Said actions were taken by YULE solely to infiltrate and deceive PITTS SALES.

15. Based upon the false information and lies conveyed by YULE to PITTS SALES in his application and interview, YULE was offered and accepted a position as a sales agent with PITTS SALES. Had PITTS SALES known of YULE's true identity, the

he was employed by KING WORLD, or that he was planning to obtain hidden camera footage while associated with PITTS SALES in order to use the footage in an uncomplimentary television story about PITTS SALES, PITTS SALES would never have offered YULE a position with the company.

16. While associated with PITTS SALES, YULE concealed and used some or all of the following to record the activities of PITTS SALES and its agents and employees while engaged in their day to day activities: (a) a video recorder, (b) a camera, (c) a tape recording device and/or (d) other video or audio recording devices, including a wireless transmission (radio) device. YULE used such devices without the knowledge or consent of PITTS SALES and without the knowledge or consent of PITTS SALES' agents or employees who were recorded by such devices.

17. After obtaining video and audio recordings and materials from PITTS SALES by criminal and fraudulent means as described in the foregoing, the producers of the planned Inside Edition segment, including POSNER, reviewed all of the hidden camera footage that YULE obtained on PITTS SALES' premises and edited the footage in order to sensationalize the story for their worldwide broadcast. The availability of the hidden camera footage which was illegally obtained by fraudulent means was the key factor in Inside Edition's decision to broadcast the segment.

18. KING WORLD also filmed a substantial portion of its story about PITTS SALES in Broward County, Florida.

19. KING WORLD produced, distributed and broadcast the segment as an expose on PITTS SALES during the Inside Edition program aired on February 3, 2003 to a worldwide audience. The televised story included hidden camera footage obtained by YULE from PITTS SALES' hotel rooms, conference rooms and company vehicles and

included communications by and conversations with PITTS SALES' agents and employees.

20. Following the broadcast of the story about PITTS SALES, KING WORLD published via the internet a report admitting that Inside Edition sent a producer "undercover" to obtain "hidden camera" footage for the televised story.

21. PITTS SALES has employed the law firm Libow & Muskat, LLP to bring this action and has agreed to pay it a reasonable attorneys' fee. Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2520, 18 U.S.C. § 1964(c) and/or Florida Statutes § 57.105, PITTS SALES is entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and costs from KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE.

22. All conditions precedent to this action have occurred, have been performed, or have been waived.

COUNT I
(Illegal Interception of Oral Communications)

23. PITTS SALES realleges and reavers the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 22 as if fully set forth herein.

24. During the time period when YULE was posing as an agent for PITTS SALES, he intentionally used or endeavored to use electronic, mechanical, or other devices to intercept and acquire the contents of oral and visual communications by PITTS SALES' agents and employees. YULE's efforts occurred on the premises of PITTS SALES, obtained or were for the purposes of obtaining information relating to the operations of PITTS SALES, and resulted in the creation of video and/or audio recordings.

25. PITTS SALES' agent and employees who uttered oral communications that were intercepted by YULE did not know or expect that their oral communications would be intercepted and did not consent to said interception. The oral communications occurred

in PITTS SALES' offices which consisted of private hotel and conference rooms and inside company vehicles where an expectation of privacy existed.

26. Defendants developed a plan to intercept and intentionally intercepted oral communications for the direct purpose of commercial advantage or private gain, for publication on Inside Edition, a for-profit television program produced, distributed and broadcast by KING WORLD.

27. Defendants intercepted oral communications for the purpose of committing criminal and/or tortious acts in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2511.

28. YULE, under the direction of POSNER, intentionally disclosed said communications to KING WORLD in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2511. KING WORLD in turn intentionally disclosed said communications to the general public in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2511.

29. PITTS SALES has suffered actual damages as a result of Defendants' violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2511. Alternatively, PITTS SALES is entitled to statutory damages.

WHEREFORE, PITTS SALES demands judgment against KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE for compensatory damages (the right to seek leave to amend to add a claim for punitive damages is reserved), prejudgment interest, attorneys' fees and costs, together with such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.

COUNT II
(Use of Illegally Intercepted Communications)

30. PITTS SALES realleges and reavers the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 22 as if fully set forth herein.

31. During the time period when YULE was associated with PITTS SALES, he intentionally used or endeavored to use electronic, mechanical, or other devices to

intercept and acquire the contents of oral and visual communications by PITTS SALES' agents and employees who did not consent to said interception.

32. YULE's activities resulted in the creation of video and/or audio recordings in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2511. YULE, under the direction of POSNER, provided these recordings to KING WORLD. Thereafter, KING WORLD used these recordings in a segment on Inside Edition. At the time of said broadcast, KING WORLD knew that the information on said recordings was obtained through the interception of oral communications in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2511.

33. KING WORLD used the illegally intercepted oral communications for the direct purpose of commercial advantage or private gain, for publication on Inside Edition, a for-profit television program produced, distributed and broadcast by KING WORLD.

34. PITTS SALES has suffered actual damages as a result of KING WORLD's violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2511. Alternatively, PITTS SALES is entitled to statutory damages.

WHEREFORE, PITTS SALES demands judgment against KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE for compensatory damages (the right to seek leave to amend to add a claim for punitive damages is reserved), prejudgment interest, attorneys' fees and costs, together with such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.

COUNT III
(Civil RICO)

35. PITTS SALES realleges and reavers the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 22 as if fully set forth herein.

36. KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE's actions in fraudulently obtaining hidden camera footage of PITTS SALES' agents, employees and operations, then transmitting said hidden camera footage via television in interstate commerce, violate 18 U.S.C. §

1343, which prohibits fraud by wire, radio or television.

37. KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE's violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1343 amounts to racketeering activity as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 1961(1)(B).

38. KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE have received income derived from this pattern of racketeering activity. Said income was used in the operation of KING WORLD.

39. KING WORLD is engaged in and its actions affect interstate commerce.

40. PITTS SALES has suffered damages as a result of KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE's racketeering activity.

WHEREFORE, PITTS SALES demands judgment against KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE for threefold its actual damages, prejudgment interest, attorneys' fees and costs, together with such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.

COUNT IV
(Fraud)

41. PITTS SALES realleges and reavers the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 22 as if fully set forth herein.

42. At his interview with PITTS SALES, YULE, under the direction of POSNER and KING WORLD, made the following material misrepresentations and omissions to PITTS SALES: (1) his date of birth (claiming that he was 25 when in fact he was 30), (2) his address (claiming that he lived in Minnesota when in fact he lived in New York), (3) his employment status (claiming that he was currently unemployed), and (4) the reasons he wanted to work with PITTS SALES (failing to disclose that he was in fact seeking to obtain hidden camera footage to use in a television story about PITTS SALES) (collectively the "Misrepresentations and Omissions").

43. YULE's Misrepresentations and Omissions were material to PITTS SALES'

decision to hire YULE.

44. YULE knew that the Misrepresentations and Omissions were false.

45. YULE intended for PITTS SALES to rely on his Misrepresentations and

Omissions so that he could procure employment as an agent with PITTS SALES in order

to get inside the company and use illegal surveillance techniques to obtain a story.

46. PITTS SALES reasonably relied on YULE's Misrepresentations and

Omissions in offering YULE a position with PITTS SALES.

47. As a result of Defendants' fraudulent activities, PITTS SALES has been

damaged.

WHEREFORE, PITTS SALES demands judgment against KING WORLD, POSNER

and YULE for compensatory damages (the right to seek leave to amend to add a claim for

punitive damages is reserved), prejudgment interest, attorneys' fees and costs, together

with such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.

COUNT V
(Trespass)

48. PITTS SALES realleges and reavers the allegations contained in paragraphs

1 through 22 as if fully set forth herein.

49. The hotel rooms, conference rooms and company vehicles where YULE

worked and made the hidden camera recordings which were subsequently televised on

Inside Edition were owned or leased by PITTS SALES for the period of time in which it

occupied such spaces. At all times when YULE was in said spaces, PITTS SALES had

the right of possession of said spaces.

50. If PITTS SALES had known YULE's true identity, YULE would not have been

offered a position with PITTS SALES, permitted to participate in meetings in the hotel or

conference rooms, or been enabled to enter the company's temporary offices for any period of time.

51. YULE, having no right or authority, entered upon said premises without the consent and against the will of PITTS SALES.

52. PITTS SALES did not truly consent to YULE's presence in their offices because of the deceptive and fraudulent nature of YULE's conduct.

53. As a result of Defendants' activities, PITTS SALES has been damaged.

WHEREFORE, PITTS SALES demands judgment against KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE for compensatory damages (the right to seek leave to amend to add a claim for punitive damages is reserved), prejudgment interest, attorneys' fees and costs, together with such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.

COUNT VI
(Tortious Interference with a Contractual Relationship)

54. PITTS SALES realleges and reavers the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 22 as if fully set forth herein.

55. At all times material herein, PITTS SALES has been and is still engaged in the business of magazine sales, doing business throughout the country. PITTS SALES has a contractual relationship with a magazine clearinghouse wherein the magazine clearinghouse fulfills PITTS SALES' magazine subscription orders.

56. Defendants' had knowledge that PITTS SALES was in the business of selling magazine subscriptions throughout the country and had a contract with a magazine clearinghouse for the fulfillment of its magazine subscription orders.

57. As a direct result of the Inside Edition story, the magazine clearinghouse that fulfills PITTS SALES' magazine subscription orders can no longer fulfill orders for numerous popular magazines and has refused to allow PITTS SALES to sell subscriptions

to these magazines.

58. Defendants intentionally interfered with PITTS SALES' contractual relationship with the magazine clearinghouse and various magazine publishers.


59. Defendants' interference with PITTS SALES' contractual relationship was unjustified.

60. PITTS SALES has been damaged as a direct result of Defendants' intentional interference with its contractual relationships.

WHEREFORE, PITTS SALES demands judgment against KING WORLD, POSNER and YULE for compensatory damages (the right to seek leave to amend to add a claim for punitive damages is reserved), prejudgment interest, attorneys' fees and costs, together with such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.



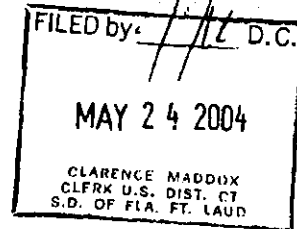
